Thomas Andrews, the naval architect who designed Titanic began his apprenticeship at Harland and Wolff aged 16. Just a decade later, he had risen to become the shipbuilder's head of design<sup>1</sup>. He oversaw<sup>2</sup> the building of Titanic and was aboard during its maiden<sup>3</sup> voyage, to make note of any minor improvements that might be needed.

## Molly Brown, Doc 4 p. 55

Molly Brown (1867-1932) was an American human-rights activist, philanthropist<sup>1</sup> and actress who survived the sinking of the RMS Titanic. Brown and her husband moved to Denver, Colorado, after achieving great prosperity<sup>2</sup> through the discovery of gold at one of his mines in 1893. While travelling in Europe, Brown got word<sup>3</sup> that her grandson was ill, and subsequently booked a trip back to the United States on the RMS Titanic, famously surviving the ship's sinking. She later took up a number of activist causes, including women's suffrage and workers' rights, and also worked as an actress. She died on October 26, 1932 in New York City.
