A day in the life of deep creek island school in the Bahamas, p. 18

7:45 am: Most students arrive on the bus. They sometimes come from far away.

8:00 am: The school day begins. Twice a week, on Mondays and Fridays, students begin with assembly¹.

8:15 am – 10:00 am: Morning class block. Students have Math and English classes every day. They have science and social studies four times per week.

10:05 am: Snack. Students always take a break from classes to eat a snack and play.

10:30 am: Mid-morning class.

11:25 am: Quiet reading. Every day, at this time, the whole school pauses for reading.

11:50 am: Lunch/Recess². Students usually have lunch with their teachers then run off to play games. After eating, the teachers often play with the students.

12:30 pm – 3:10 pm: Afternoon class block. Afternoons can be very different.

Students sometimes have academic classes like English or science, but once or twice a week they have PE³, sailing or swimming or they can prepare their scuba-diving certificate.

3:15 pm: After-school clubs. Students can join a variety of different clubs and activities, like sports and choir⁴.
